Walking a Path of the Heart Dr. Darlene Sellers reflects on her 23 years at Northern.

"I was a very non-traditional student," Darlene says, smiling. "So, it's lovely to work at an institution where we can help non-traditional students achieve their dreams."

Dr. Darlene Sellers will retire this summer after working at Northern for 23 years. It's a big task to ask someone to reflect on a quarter of their life and ask for the highlights, but it is clear from our interview that Darlene absolutely loves what she has accomplished at Northern. For her, the greatest joy of her work is seeing students achieve their dreams.

As interim Dean of the College of Arts, Sciences, and Education (CASE), Darlene is constantly busy. She's always thinking about improving her programs, or how to prepare students to be the best educators they can be. Despite setting a date for retirement, she's as invested as she's always been in Northern's success.

PIONEERING A PROGRAM

For the last few years, she has been focused on strengthening the teacher education

program in Great Falls, an opportunity that she helped create twenty years ago

The Great Falls education program is a partnership with Great Falls College-MSU and MSU-Northern. Students typically start at Great Falls College to earn their associate's degree, (or they may already have one) and then they transfer into Northern's education program and complete the last two years of their bachelor's degree.

Students take their classes in the evening so paraprofessionals, full-time workers, or even Air Force members at Malmstrom can find the time to pursue their teaching credentials. This opportunity allows students to partake in Northern's curriculum from afar.

Darlene spearheaded the program. "It was an exciting time to be there, to deliver the program, to meet the needs of the community," she remembers. When she spoke to the Board of Regents in 2000 to explain why the program was important and necessary for Northern Montana, twelve students from Great Falls stood at her side and many more submitted letters of support. The program has been going strong ever since.

COUNSELING FOR CHANGE

But for Darlene, the Counselor Education graduate program is her greatest pride and joy. "We moved the program to be an intensive, weekend course," she says. It's the only weekend Counselor Education program in the state. It was important to her to tailor this program for the non-traditional student.

Not many people can uproot their lives for two or three years and move to a bigger city in Montana, just to earn a master's degree that they want to use back in their home town. Darlene stresses that Northern's greatest strength is that it helps people achieve their dream – people who may not otherwise be able to.

Everywhere she goes in the Northern Montana region, Darlene runs into former students that came through one of her programs. 90% of all the school counselors in the Great Falls school districts graduated from Northern's program. It's obvious that she is filled with pride for her former students. She's seen students that graduated twenty years ago still teaching in rural schools, or who now hold Doctorates and are administrators, focused on making a positive change in their communities.

"For some people, they can have this dream, but they may not be able to pursue it due to barriers like money, family obligations, being place-bound...but Northern offers programs for those people. We provide for all those who otherwise may not meet their dream."

"Looking back on my work and my life, I'm filled with hope," she says. "I've always felt that I've followed my heart, and I feel blessed that I was able to do that." Dr. Sellers' last day of work will be this summer, but she's cherishing her final days and staying in the moment. From all of us at the Foundation, we thank all educators and we wish Darlene well on her next adventure!

Taking the Next Step

The Career Center welcomes a new Director and adapts to new challenges

In a normal year, the Career Center is an area of campus where students nervously prepare for their lives after college. They sign up for practice interviews, attend resume workshops, company presentations, and networking opportunities. The Career Center is where the "real world" meets the college world. It's a stepping stone that brings Northern students closer to the lives they've dreamed about.

That's in a normal year. But facing a pandemic, economic hardship across the country, and having to shift to an entirely virtual world, the Career Center had to adapt all of their processes. "Any other year I could tell you exactly what we did, when we did it, and how it was done," Employment Services Coordinator Jennifer "Jen" Henderson recounts. "But this year, I didn't have a clue how we were going to deliver our services."

Jen is a well-known member of the Northern community. She's been at the Career Center since 1985. In the midst of the pandemic this past August, Lisa Moisey joined the office as the new Director of Career Services & Industry Relations. The two of them worked together to come up with a strategy to continue offering effective resources to students and employers.

Lisa was excited to help execute the mission of the Career Center, which is to support the MSUN community by providing a comprehensive network of employment services for students, graduates, alumni, and employers. In step with faculty and staff across the campus, they work to help every student become "career ready".

CONNECTING STUDENTS AND EMPLOYERS

In particular, they focus on connecting students to employers for part-time jobs, co-ops, internships, and their first job after college. When graduates excel at their companies, employers come back to Northern to recruit more students.

One of the key programs coordinated by the Career Center is the Co-op program. Northern works collaboratively with a network of employers and partners who offer students the opportunity to gain valuable, hands-on work experience while they are in school.

Students can earn college credit for these real-life job opportunities and they are often paid. During the 2019-2020 school year the students in co-ops collectively earned over half a million dollars for those credits.

It's a win-win for everyone. Students come away with a robust, on-the-job experience and personal connections that can be gateways to future employment. Employers often use co-ops as a recruiting tool, particularly for students in high-demand technical fields.

EXCITED FOR THE FUTURE

"Despite the challenges," Lisa says of this year, "it's been a wonderful experience working to connect students and employers. I feel incredibly honored to be part of the Northern team. Especially when we get that awesome feedback from employers about how our students and graduates are well-prepared, hardworking, and dedicated!"

"I think I can speak for everyone and say that we are really hoping to see each other in-person next Fall," Jen says. But she notes that this new virtual world has presented opportunities that employers like and that they will continue to use. Those innovations will help bolster more opportunities for students and alumni.

The resources of the Career Center are open to all alumni, whether you're searching for a job or wanting to recruit new employees.

They have a database of opportunities online at Career Express, where at any given time, they have hundreds of listings of employers seeking people with experience. If you are an employer, you can also post positions on Career Express.

Leaving a Legacy

Josh and Laura Gomez make a difference raising funds for an Endowed Scholarship

Losing a loved one is difficult. In February 2017, the MSU-Northern community lost Rebecca "Becky" Nicholson in a car accident. Becky was 43 years old, and had worked at Northern for over 16 years. A Light herself, she graduated from Northern with her Bachelor of Arts in 1999 and had a fulfilling career in higher education, working as a Librarian, Administrative Associate for the College of Arts and Sciences, and finally as the Disability Coordinator.

After she passed away, Dr. Carol Reifschneider organized a scholarship called the Becky Nicholson Memorial Scholarship. Not long after, a group of Becky's friends were discussing how to honor her life in a real and meaningful way. Josh and Laura Gomez, husband and wife as well as employees of Northern, remember the moment that they knew just what to do.

"Becky spread love wherever she went," Laura said. "We wanted the scholarship to be able to positively impact as many Northern students as possible." Their goal was to help raise enough money to endow the scholarship — that way, the award would exist perpetually.

Josh and Laura organized a pint night fundraiser at Triple Dog Brewing in Havre to help raise money to fund the endowment.

By the end of the year, they hit their goal of \$10,000. And every year since 2017, they continue to host a pint night at Triple Dog for Becky's scholarship, and to honor and remember their friend. "We want the endowment to grow!" Josh and Laura agree. By increasing that endowment level, the investment earnings grow and lead to a larger scholarship for students in perpetuity.

Raising funds for the Becky Nicholson Endowment and Scholarship is a group effort. "We would like to thank Mike and Erin Garrity (owners of Triple Dog) for hosting an event every single year for this scholarship, as well as our friends and the community who have donated," they say. "The scholarship would not be where it is now without their support."

Becky's light and positivity continues to brighten the lives of students at Northern through the love and support of her friends and community members. Look for another pint night fundraiser in February 2022!



Kyle Samson, '08



Kyle Samson transferred to Northern and was both captain and starting quarterback for the Lights from 2004 -2006. He was also a three-time allconference selection (2004-2006), two-time All-American selection (2005, 2006), and was named the Frontier Conference's Most Valuable Player in 2006.

During his tenure as a Light, Kyle set 21 school records! He earned his bachelor's degree in Health/Physical Education from Northern in 2008 and started his coaching career at MSUN where he was the Offensive Coordinator and QB Coach for 7 years between 2007-2013. Under Samson's direction, the Lights Offense was ranked in the top 10 in the nation from 2010-2013.

Kyle is currently the Head Football Coach at Montana Tech and previous to Tech he was the Head Football Coach at Flathead High School in Kalispell for 5 Years. Kyle is married to Brooke (Schwan), and they have 3 children; son Troy (10), daughter Jordyn (8) and son Beau (4).



Marc Samson, '08

Marc Samson attended Northern from 2004-2008. He was Second Team All-Conference Safety in 2004, First Team All-Conference 2005 - 2007 and First Team NAIA All-American at Safety in 2006, 2007. He was also three-time NAIA Academic All-American.

In 2007 Marc lead the NAIA in passes defended (26) and was

second in the Nation in interceptions (8). Marc holds Northern Lights records for most interceptions in a game (3), season (8) and career (17), passes defended in season (26) and career (53).

Marc graduated from MSU-Northern with Honors with a BA in Health Promotion in 2008 and continued on with his studies, graduating from the University of Montana School of Physical Therapy in 2011. Currently Marc is a Physical Therapist for the VA in Helena, MT and is married to Katie. They have 2 children, Kayley (11) and AJ (8).
